NO Trafficking in Persons

The United States has a “zero tolerance” policy against human rights abuses. All U.S. Defense contractors must treat employees fairly, domestically and abroad

Employees supporting U.S. installations abroad have many rights, including to:

- hold their passport or other identification documents
- receive agreed upon wages on time without unlawful deductions
- take lunch- and work-breaks
- leave the place of employment at any time
- report grievances without fear of reprisal
- have a copy of their employment contract in a language they understand
- work hours and be paid wages in line with legal in-country wages
- if housing is provided, live in housing that meets host-country housing and safety standards
