

SUBJECT: Law Enforcement Training for Combating Trafficking in Persons

Department of Defense (DoD) Law Enforcement and Investigative Agencies must understand the laws, regulations, and departmental policies regarding Trafficking in Persons (TIP). In accordance with DoD Instruction 2200.01 "Combating Trafficking in Persons (CTIP)," dated September 15, 2010, heads of the DoD Components must "conduct an annual CTIP awareness training program" and provide information on "criminal cases on DoD personnel referrals for TIP or TIP-related offenses."

To assist Law Enforcement and investigative agencies in carrying out their responsibilities as prescribed in DoD Instruction 2200.01, the Department has updated its Law Enforcement training module on TIP to reflect recent rules and regulations. The module reviews general TIP awareness training, identifies the crime of TIP and actions to take, and provides scenarios for appropriate response. This training is mandatory for Law Enforcement personnel and is available on the CTIP website at <http://ctip.defense.gov/Training>.

Please note that those taking the Law Enforcement Training are not required to also take the General Awareness CTIP Training. My office's point of contact for CTIP is Ms. Linda Dixon.
