The Combating Trafficking in Persons (CTIP) Program Management Office (PMO) is responsible for developing CTIP policy, trainings and awareness resources as well as CTIP planning, resource management, and program evaluation for all of the DoD. The CTIP Office ensures that the Services, Combatant Commands, and Defense Agencies have the necessary tools to prevent trafficking.

DEVELOP TRAINING

The CTIP PMO trainings provide TIP overview, signs and indicators, key laws, policies, and regulations, and reporting procedures. The CTIP PMO offers a series of trainings for various DoD audiences:

- **General Awareness Training** for all DoD personnel
- **Investigative Professionals Training** for DoD personnel who conduct inquiries, investigations, inspections, assessments, audits, or evaluations
- **Acquisitions Personnel Training and Toolkit** for all DoD employees who are responsible for monitoring contracts, grants, and cooperative agreements
- **Department of Defense Education Activity (DODEA) Training** for all DoD school personnel
- **Leadership Resource** to help commanders and other leaders understand human trafficking and how to address it in their commands
- **Chaplain Training and Toolkit** for DoD Chaplains
- **Healthcare Personnel Training and Toolkit** for DoD healthcare personnel

WHAT WE DO

DEVELOP POLICY

The CTIP PMO is responsible for the development and updating of the Department of Defense Instruction (DoDI) 2200.01, "Combating Trafficking in Persons (CTIP)." The DoDI establishes policy, assigns responsibilities, and prescribes training requirements for CTIP.

DEVELOP AWARENESS MATERIAL

The CTIP PMO develops awareness materials for use by DoD components and defense contractors including:

- **Wallet-sized cards** in 10 languages that outline worker's rights and provide information on where to report suspected cases of trafficking in persons (TIP)
- **Posters** in 22 languages that describe how to recognize and report trafficking
- **PSAs** that feature special CTIP topics
- **Survivor stories** relating their experiences in written narrative and in video
- **CTIP Student Guide to Prevent Human Trafficking** for military-connected high school students to learn more about human trafficking. Companion Parent Guide available
