Keyana Marshall is a survivor of domestic minor sex trafficking, the commercial sex industry, and the federal criminal justice system. She is an author, speaker, and founder of the non-profit organization Restorative Community Concepts (RCC)*, which provides services to the community and supports trafficking survivors through the "We Survived" program. Keyana holds an associate degree in business and is currently pursuing her general bachelor's degree. She also runs the Redbarn Boutique*, a part of RCC, offering survivors entrepreneurial opportunities through free consignment spaces. Her autobiography, "Being Keyana Marshall: Surviving Sex Trafficking and the Federal Criminal Justice System"**, is under revision and set to be re-released in print and all online platforms in spring 2025. Keyana resides in Wooster, Ohio, with her husband, continuing her advocacy work for trafficking survivors. She continues to speak, write, and advocate for systemic changes to support survivors in rebuilding their lives.
