

Women, Peace and Security Act

Public Law 115-68

Recognizes the different impact of conflict on women and children, including increased vulnerability of exploitation and trafficking

72% of detected trafficking victims are female

Prevalent forms of trafficking in the context of armed conflict include:

- Commercial sexual exploitation, including forced marriage
- Forced labor of men and women to support military operations
- Coercion, recruitment, and exploitation of child soldiers
- Abducting refugees or internally displaced persons for use as sex slaves

Human trafficking is a human rights violation and fuels conflict. It affects men, women, boys, and girls differently.
